

Dear Brighton Festival Chorus,

I see from your website at <https://bfc.org.uk/noticeboarditem/carmina-burana/> that you use midi files from learnchoralmusic.co.uk to help you learn your choral parts. I have written a web app that plays midi files, which is designed to help singers learn their parts. It works on smartphones, tablets, Windows, Macs, etc. There's no need to download and install anything. It's free, and it's at <https://choralmusictutor.com>

To play a piece of music:

- * Find a midi file for it somewhere on the internet
- * Copy its address to the clipboard (right-click and choose "Copy Link")
- * Go to <https://choralmusictutor.com>
- * Click the File tab
- * Click the "Paste ..." button (or click the "Open a midi file from the internet" button and type or paste in the URL)
- * That opens the file and takes you to the Mixer tab
- * Emphasize your part by clicking its Emph checkbox
- * Click the Play button to play

At this point, you can create a link to the file for someone else to use by clicking the Share tab, then clicking the "Copy ... with my changes" button. You can then paste the link into an email or onto a website.

The link will look something like this:

If you click that link now, you'll see that the midi file is opened and the Bass part is already emphasized. There's more information about creating links on the Help tab.
